### **Mayor's Corner**

Motion was made by Alderman Dear, seconded by Alderman Underwood, to approve the agenda. All present voting yea, motion carried.

### **Updated quotes for Sports Park Lighting**

Mayor Graves went over the quotes we received for lighting at fields 7, 8, and 9 at the Sports Park. Mayor Graves stated we presented a quote for this work at the last meeting, and the Board requested an additional quote for just bulb replacement.

Alderman McConnell stated that he spoke with the owner at Advance Electric, he said that those poles are in bad condition, very brittle. He did not advise putting new fixtures on them, doesn't think the poles will last much longer.

Motion was made by Alderman Garrett, seconded by Alderman McConnell, to approve the quote from Advance Electric to replace 9 bulbs total on fields 7, 8, and 9 for the quoted amount of \$11,486.00. All present voting yea, motion carried.

### **Department Reports**

Mayor Graves advised the Board they have Department Reports in their packets. Mayor stated that Crystal wasn't able to be at our last meeting, so he wanted to make sure to acknowledge the fantastic job she did during the ice store. Crystal kept everything running, picked up employees in her personal vehicle, and unfortunately wrecked her truck due to the ice.

Crystal Kelley advised the Mayor and Board that everything is going good. They are just extremely understaffed, and some are getting a lot of OT because of that.

Alderman Dear asked if FOSA is still helping.

Crystal Kelley answered yes sir, they do.

Alderman Underwood asked if they still allow volunteers from schools.

Crystal Kelley answered yes, we use them. They are very helpful. We even have field trips from schools that visit the shelter.

Police Chief Vanderford advised the Mayor and Board that everything is going well in the Police Department. They have training going on, two officers in SWAT school which is wrapping up Friday. We did a lot of work with Federal Partners in February.

Fire Chief Foresman advised the Mayor and Board that everything is going well in the Fire Department. We have various staff on medical, a couple of those should be back next week. We've had to fill in spots due to this. We have one at the Academy and doing well there. We have started testing for the open Drivers spot. We went to the First Responders Cucus at the Capitol. It went good. Chief Foresman advised that Chantay has been doing a lot of good work with various Fire & Life Safety trainings.

FLSE/PIO Chantay Rhone advised the Mayor and Board that she holds a Child Safety class twice a year, and they have proven to be very helpful. Mrs. Rhone stated that she often has participants come to her well after a class to thank her. We went over CPR at the school's STEM night event. We also received good feedback from that. Thursday night we are hosting the Girl Scouts for their First Aid Badge.

Alderman Tanksley asked Mr. Hodges about horses sitting at 205 Shaker Drive, the Public Works barricades. They've been there a long time.

Mr. Deran Cathey stated they are in my yard. There has been a wet spot in my yard for a long time, the staff came out to look and put the barricades up so that no one falls, but I haven't seen them back to do anything since.

Mayor Graves asked Mr. Hodges to make sure to get the information on this.

Director of Operations Stephen Hodges stated that he would get on that.

Mr. Hodges stated that the gentleman that had the hole patcher machine stopped by on his way back from Clarksdale to show us the truck. I would like to propose a step-down version of that truck. Mr. Hodges advised the Mayor and Board that everything with Building & Planning is going well. They've been reviewing plans. Building & Planning went from a department with zero staff and no policies in place, to an actual department with the needed staff, policies and procedures. They have all done great.

Mr. Hodges advised that Public Works is doing well also. We recently lost an employee that has been with us for about 8 years. We have 4 open positions now.

Jamie, Katie and I have been working to get information to MEMA/FEMA for possible funding for the extra expenses due to the ice storm event.

Mr. Hodges advised that we are looking at May 1<sup>st</sup> as a start date for Waste Pro to take over our garbage collection services. The approved rates will go into effect starting April 1<sup>st</sup>. We have been working on putting a plan together to get information out to the customers regarding route changes, pick up schedules, chares, rules, etc. It will probably be in the form of mail outs, on the bills, website and social media. As a reminder, in the agreement we agreed that we will continue to use the city cans until they need replacement. At that time, they will be picked up and replaced with a Waste Pro can.

Alderman Dear asked how many guys will come down from that department to another when we change over.

Stephen Hodges answered three, 2 of which will go to other CDL driver positions.

Alderman McConnell asked about selling our garbage trucks.

Stephen Hodges stated we are working on that.

Consent Agenda

Mayor Graves went over consent agenda items 6 – 26, asked if anyone had any questions.

Alderman Tanksley asked if we could start having new hires at the meeting when we are approving to hire, so we can put a face with a name. We hire people all of the time but never see them.

Alderman Dear stated they will have to pass a background and drug screening first. It may be a waste of time.

Alderman Tanksley stated we do that anyway. It's not a waste of time, I will be here anyway. If they want a job for the City of Senatobia they can be here. I just want to be able to see their face, the people we are going to hire, I want to be able to put a face with a name. I might see them out at Walmart, I want to be able to speak to them.

Mayor Graves stated he doesn't have a problem with that.

Alderman Tanksley stated last meeting why didn't I receive the application for the utility billing new hire. I didn't receive her application in my packet.

Mayor Graves asked which specific person is he asking about.

Alderman Garrett stated I believe it is Kristan.

City Clerk Katie Harbin stated normally those are in the packets unless I don't receive a copy of them to send. I would have to look back to see if I had that one, if so, that mistake would be on me.

Alderman Garrett stated that he has some park stuff and stuff to ask the Fire Chief, for executive session.

Mayor Graves asked if it qualifies for executive session.

Alderman Garrett answered it does.

Mayor Graves stated we need to know or have these things before the agenda is approved. Mayor Graves asked Alderman Garrett to be a little more specific. We need to make sure it is a legal reason to go into executive session. These things need to be done before the agenda is approved.

Alderman Tanksley stated I don't have a problem with it.

Mayor Graves stated I don't either, but we have to make sure we follow the law.

Alderman Garrett stated he doesn't have to go into executive; I was just trying to respect the Department Heads. I can ask right here.

Alderman Tanksley stated if it's personnel we can.

City Attorney Kenneth Stockton stated if its personnel, it should be executive. If you don't want to be sued.

Mayor Graves stated but we do need to know these things to change the agenda before it's adopted.

Alderman Garrett stated I have no problem doing it during the Department Reports. It's a basic question regarding policy, that I've from guys.

City Attorney Kenneth Stockton stated if it's not dealing with a specific individual then it doesn't have to be in executive.

Alderman Garrett stated, no it's more of a policy and procedures.

City Attorney Kenneth Stockton stated ok, well you wouldn't have to go into executive session for that. As long as it's not directed at a specific employee.

Alderman Garrett stated no, it's not.

Alderman Garrett stated to the Fire Chief that about 85% of the guys, you know I know everyone of them, they call me, there is a problem with whatever this system is we are clocking in with. We are using a clock in system; it puts their vacation in for a year in advance. What kind of system is this? Who authorized it?

Fire Chief Foresman answered it is a web-based program. We used rebate money to pay for it. We've had a problem in the past few years with people scheduling off time way to close to the time they are requesting off, and we've had problems filling the shift. For example, last fall I had 46 shifts to cover, in a month. We needed a way to make it more efficient. The clock in system, we've given them plenty preparation and grace been given. We haven't penalizing anyone for not knowing how to use the time clock. It will just take time to learn and get used to using it. In the end it will be a good thing. On their annual leave time the leave time they put in, based on the SOGs, as long they put in for that leave time before that actual date, they are guaranteed those dates off. It's still not a guarantee that they will be off when they put in for it. If they plug that date in, as long as there's someone to cover it, they will be off.

Alderman Garrett stated his biggest concerns with the time clock is that we are operating on two different time clock in systems. If they catch a call and stay over, what about their OT. Fire Chief Foresman stated they are, and will, be compensated for any time that they are here, no matter what.

Alderman Garrett stated I'm kind of lost with the whole time clock. What is the purpose of them clocking in.

Fire Chief Foresman stated it is also used for redundancy for officers.

Alderman Garrett asked don't we have Captains.

Fire Chief Foresman answered yes. If they clock in at station 1 it gives them a way of ensuring the employee is there, another level of redundancy, and clocking in and out.

Alderman Garrett asked so the city authorized it.

Fire Chief Foresman answered yes, we used rebate money for the web-based system.

Alderman Garrett stated I mean the men clocking in. They work for us, the will and pleasure of the Board. That is a policy that we have to put in. We have to approve if they clock in.

Fire Chief Foresman this was designed and intended to make things more efficient, not to be a controversy. We don't operate the same or have the same hours as other departments, I did not know that we needed authorization to show an employee clocks in.

Alderman Garrett stated I get that, but when 85% of the guys call me, then that's a problem.

Fire Chief Foresman stated yes that is a problem.

Alderman Garrett when they call me to ask if we put these procedures in, and I don't recall. I think it's a Board decision whether these guys clock in or not. It's not some kind of program you guys come up with, to say. Does this program track them, I don't know.

Fire Chief Foresman answered no it does not track them.

Alderman Garrett stated how do I know, nothing came to us.

Fire Chief Foresman stated it is a scheduling software, that is all it is.

Mayor Graves stated why do they not go through the proper channels, the 85% you spoke of.

Alderman Garrett stated, the 85% don't go through the proper channels because they are scared of retaliation. I'm a fireman, been so for several years. They all know me, of course they are going to talk to me. Senatobia is a small town.

Alderman Tanksley stated the thing about the 85% is it starts at the top. If they are supposed to come here, why didn't they do that. That's where it starts, it doesn't start with the 85%. Starts right at the top. If the top didn't come here to get it authorized, why is that then.

Mayor Graves stated it's day to day operations.

Alderman Garrett stated it wasn't approved by us.

Alderman Garrett stated I don't agree with the clocking in. I know you have SOGs, SOPs, I just can't see the benefit, your benefit, to have these guys clock in. If we have Captains on these shifts that's not able to do their job, then they are in the wrong place.

Fire Chief Foresman stated we had multiple meetings before and after going live with this software, with very few complaints. We can get rid of that part if that is what you want.

Alderman Garrett stated they aren't going to talk to you because they don't think anything is going to get done. I'm just being honest.

Mayor Graves that's why we have Chief. Let him run his department.

Alderman Garrett stated I had to find out from other sources. I'm not one to be the last one to know something. If I'm last to know then that's a problem. And it's something that we didn't authorize. They work for the will and pleasure of the Board. That goes a long way.

Alderman Garrett stated I don't agree with the clocking in. It's not like we have a lot of staff. The Captains need to do their job.

Mayor Graves asked so you don't consider that day to day operations.

Alderman Garrett stated what.

Mayor Graves stated how they are clocking in and out.

Alderman Garrett stated do you talk to the guys.

Mayor Graves stated the Firemen, obviously not like you do. I'm here.

Alderman Underwood asked to clarify, this doesn't have anything to do with their pay.

Alderman Garrett stated it has nothing to do with the pay. Why do they have to clock in for his good. If it has nothing to do with the pay then why do they have to clock in for his good. To see that they are at work. That's the Captains job. I don't get it.

Mayor Graves stated I don't understand what your concern is, what are you trying to accomplish.

Alderman Dear stated is it a clock, punch timecard.

Alderman Dear stated Chief said they get paid.

Fire Chief Foresman stated we still have a pay sheet we use and approve for payroll.

Alderman Tanksley asked how much did it cost, we didn't authorize anything.

Fire Chief Foresman stated we used rebate money for it. We did research, looked at software other departments use all over the state. This software was spoke well of, we looked into it, it cost less than others so we chose it.

Alderman Dear stated is it hurting someone.

Alderman Garrett stated it's hurting the man.

Alderman Dear stated what's it doing to them.

Alderman Garrett stated they don't like it.

Alderman Dear stated I don't like a lot of things. This is the way management is. They have to get used to it.

Alderman Tanksley stated we didn't authorize it.

Alderman Dear stated we don't authorize a lot of things they do. well do we authorize them to walk outside. This is day to day stuff.

Alderman Tanksley stated if you change policy it has to come before the Board.

Alderman Dear stated that's not a policy thing.

Alderman Garrett stated it has to do with the mens; they work for us.

Alderman Dear stated what's it hurting.

Mayor Graves stated it seems administrative to me.

Alderman Underwood stated can you still get what you need, the benefit. You are saying the benefit of the scheduling is greater than the clock in part. You and the staff see the information, and it is more beneficial for all.

Fire Chief Foresman answered yes, it was more for redundancy, scheduling. The biggest benefit is scheduling shifts. It is easier for scheduling; it shows who's off and what OT is available.

Alderman Garrett stated I don't like it. If I work OT, I want to be paid.

Alderman Underwood stated that Fire Chief is saying the scheduling is the biggest benefit of the software. It's a helpful tool, for them all, like a calendar.

Alderman Tanksley stated if we don't have to authorize the software, department heads can spend money, and we won't know anything about it.

Alderman Garrett stated I think we should do away with the timeclock.

Fire Chief Foresman stated ok, the time clock is gone. Again, we had training and multiple meetings. Had no complaints.

Alderman Garrett stated if we get rid of the clock in, I'm good.

Alderman Tanksley stated you are over day to day; did you know about this.

Mayor Graves stated I am over day to day; I meet with my departments regularly. We have them run the day to day in their departments, I don't micromanage. Also, as you remember, I am a part-time Mayor.

Alderman Tanksley questioned the sports park concession, where does that money go.

City Clerk Katie Harbin answered it goes into the Concession revenue line item in the Tourism budget.

Alderman Tanksley asked what line item.

City Clerk Katie Harbin answered it starts with 110-000.

Alderman Tanksley asked what's the process with the park and the bank.

Alderman McConnell stated didn't we go cashless.

City Clerk Katie Harbin answered yes sir we did.

Alderman McConnell stated what about the gate fees, are they cashless.

City Clerk Katie Harbin stated I don't know that answer because if those are charged, they are collected by the organization hosting the tournament.

Alderman Underwood stated yes, those are charged for tournaments.

A recreational softball board member, in the audience stated they do them by agreement, and are cash.

Alderman Tanksley stated what about concession.

City Clerk Katie Harbin answered they batch out what they receive that day, lock it up in a bank bag, turn it into city hall to receipt and verify and then it is sent to the bank to be deposited. Key in the payments into our accounting software to the concession revenue line item.

Alderman Tanksley stated so is it in a separate fund by itself, if not it should be, not mixed with general fund or anything else.

City Clerk Katie Harbin answered it is kept in a separate fund, the Tourism fund, in its own line item.

Alderman Tanksley stated is it tourism from the ballpark, tourism from them, what.

City Clerk Katie Harbin answered it is from the ballpark, special tax on hotels and special tax on restaurants.

Alderman Tanksley stated can we get that information after every ball game.

Mayor Garves stated you can get any information you want.

City Clerk Katie Harbin stated you want to know what every game brings in.

Mayor Graves stated it would be hard to know what every game brings in.

City Clerk Katie Harbin stated do you mean every day or every tournament.

Alderman Tanksley stated I don't know.

Alderman Garrett stated per tournament would be good. Per game would be a lot.

A recreational softball board member stated we don't do the tournaments, so per day would be good.

Alderman Tanksley asked what line item on the docket is what we pay for concessions, what are we spending.

Mayor Graves stated it's on your docket every meeting.

Alderman Tanksley stated I don't know what it's coded as, I want to know exactly where you put it and what's going on with it. If we don't know what's going on out there, she should come up with some kind of process. We have money going from several different hands.

Mayor Graves stated that it is way more organized than it was before. We've gone cashless, which makes it better also.

Alderman Garrett asked who does the lights out there.

Mayor Graves stated the app does fields 1 through 6, on a schedule. Fields 7, 8, and 9 still have to be done manually.
